






Challenges in automated accessibility checks



Not all accessibility requirements can be programmatically checked

How serious accessibility issues can be found







Limitations of automatic tools in assessing accessibility

Automated accessibility testing tools cannot assess all the requirements of EPUB Accessibility and WCAG because some criteria require human judgment or context

understanding.



To be 100% compliant a human in the loop in needed!





LIA receipt for ebook Quality Assurance

There is probably a need for an expert





LIA receipt: human + machine


- We have developed a **system for ebook Quality Assurance title-by-title** that benefits from the best of machines and the best of humans:
 - Methodology + internally developed tools + IT infrastructure
- At the end of the checking process, accessibility metadata are automatically generated
- We have very qualified in-house staff who specialize in accessible digital publishing (not easy to find!)
- We stay constantly up-to-date on new standards and evolving technologies (thanks to work in Working Groups)
- We offer support to content producers who don't know how to make their content accessible

In union there is strength: human + machine







Common accessibility issues found in ebooks



LIA experts have analyzed more than 400 ebooks declared as "accessible"





Most frequently accessibility issues in ebooks declared as "accessible"


- Alternative text for images not meaningful
- Images of text with wrong description
- Words of indeterminate language
- Missing semantic tagging
- Semantic tagging used for visual effect
- Content identified only by color
- Accessibility metadata that does not reflect the actual content

Best practices for content producers



An accessible ebook is a high-quality ebook for everyone







Recommendations for content producers

- Study accessibility specifications
- Understand how to use authoring tools in an accessible way
- Plan your work with accessibility in mind from the beginning
- Ask an expert when you don't know



And then... test!


Use automated in-house tools

Rely on experts for accessibility checking

Accessible publication!

- to check the publication as it is being created
- ensure that the minimum level of accessibility is achieved
- for custom tests and manual checks
- for metadata creation
- rely on experienced accessible digital publishing auditors

How to assure that publications are accessible






As for web accessibility...
